

COURSE OUTLINE

The EFAW course complies with Health and Safety Executive (H.S.E) regulations and enables delegates to be able to deal with a variety of emergencies in the workplace where a 3 day First Aid at Work qualification is not deemed necessary. Delegates must be a minimum of 14 years of age although cannot claim the title of 'Emergency First Aider in the Workplace until they are 16 yrs old.

COURSE DURATION

A minimum of 6 hours

COURSE OUTCOMES

By the end of the course candidates will be able to demonstrate the essential knowledge and skills needed to deal with emergency first aid in the Workplace.

ASSESSMENT

The course tutor will carry out an on-going assessment.

CERTIFICATION

All successful delegates will achieve an HSE Emergency First Aid at Work qualification that is valid for 3 years. To re-qualify, you will have to undergo another one day course in 3 years time. It is recommended that annual refresher training is attended.

THE TRAINER

A First Aid Instructor, whose qualifications are acceptable to the Health & Safety Executive for teaching statutory First Aid and whose Registration is acceptable to Nuco Training Ltd, will conduct the course. The trainer will be informed of any changes to procedures and practices as laid down by the European Resuscitation Council and the Health & Safety Executive.
